Hokie Spirit Tribute concert held at Artomatic raises more than \$1,000 for Virginia Tech

D.C. Music for Relief is pleased to announce that the Hokie Spirit Tribute Concert fundraiser, an all-day event held on Saturday, April 28, 2007, in Crystal City, Arlington, Va., raised \$1,007.08 on behalf of the victims of the tragic events of April 16 at Virginia Tech.

Mac M. Traore, founder of D.C. Music for Relief, which produced the event, presented in person a check for the full amount to Timothy G. Corvin, Virginia Tech's associate vice president for development. Traore also presented several poster boards listing the names of the victims that was signed by the donors. The presentation was held on Thursday, May 3, at Virginia Tech's Office of University Development in Blacksburg, Va.



The fundraising event was held in collaboration with Artomatic, the visual and performing arts multi-week extravaganza featuring 700 local independent artists.

D.C. Music for Relief is a Silver Spring, Md.-based organization that provides financial and material resources on a not-for-profit basis to victims of disasters by organizing periodic concerts featuring performances voluntarily donated by concerned musicians.

The organization previously has worked in collaboration with CARE, Save the Children, AmeriCares and Habitat for Humanity to collect donations via concerts for victims of the 2004 Southeast Asia tsunami and Hurricane Katrina.
